High School Arts Show April 17

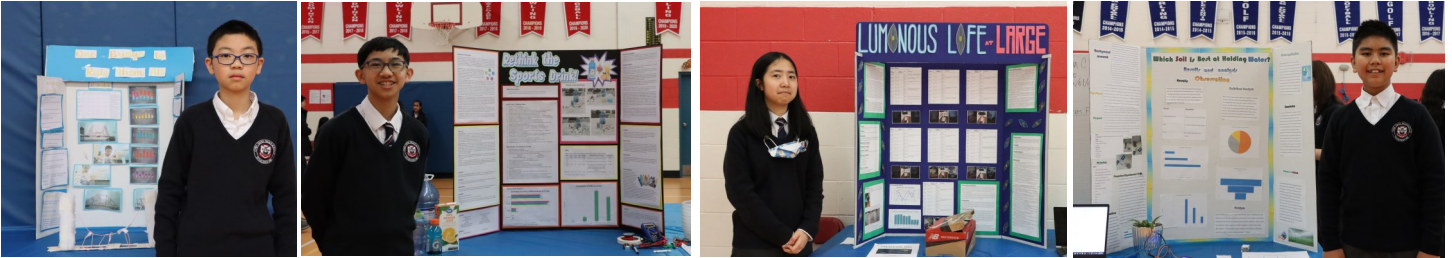

Measles

We ask all parents to read this information from the Ontario Ministry of Health!

Acknowledging that there has been an increase of measles cases in Ontario, the Ministry of Health has shared the following information that you may find useful: "Measles is a highly contagious disease that spreads through the air when an infected person breathes, coughs, sneezes or talks and can remain in the air or on surfaces for up to two hours. The best way to protect yourself and your loved ones is through vaccination. The measles vaccine is a safe and extremely effective way to prevent measles. Parents and caregivers are reminded to ensure that your child's immunizations are up to date and to report immunization records using the Immunization Connect Ontario (ICON) tool, accessed through your [local public health unit's](#) website. Following vacation travel, parents and caregivers should also monitor for symptoms of measles and call their health care provider immediately if they suspect their child is infected or has been exposed to measles. Parents and caregivers should not bring their child to a health care facility or office without calling ahead first if they have been exposed or have symptoms. For more information, visit ontario.ca/measles."

APRIL 8, PD Day and Solar Eclipse

Parents are reminded that Monday, April 8 is a PD Day. It is a non-school day for students as our staff will be participating in professional development sessions.
