

Remembrance Day Observances - Monday, November 11

As November begins, our staff and students are once again preparing to honour the courageous individuals who fought for the freedoms we cherish as Canadians. This year, our school will observe Remembrance Day on Monday, November 11th.


On Remembrance Day, students and staff will be participating in Remembrance Day assemblies. At 11 a.m. on November 11th, we will observe two minutes of silence, a solemn and significant moment on Remembrance Day. "The Last Post" will be played as our students stand in respectful silence to honour and remember those who sacrificed for our country.

Leading up to the assemblies, Grade 2-6 students will be exploring poems about poppies to learn about the significance of wearing them; students in grade 3 will be reading and writing about the bravery shown by our veterans; grade 4 and 5 students will be writing letters of gratitude to our veterans while grade 6 students will write warm, positive postcards for peace that will be delivered to Veterans in long-term care facilities.

Grade 7-8 students will be joining the HS students in an assembly which will highlight the stories of bravery and courage by those who fought for our freedoms and they will also be reciting poems created by students and a reading of "In Flanders Fields," a war poem written during the First World War by Canadian physician Lieutenant-Colonel John McCrae.

As a way to recognize a successful academic year, our grade 6-8 students will have the wonderful opportunity to enjoy an overnight trip in June. Our Grade 6 students and staff will be travelling to Muskoka Woods, an overnight summer camp in Ontario with a prime lakefront location on Lake Rosseau, while our Grade 7-8 students will journey to our nation's capital, Ottawa, from June 11-13th, 2025. The end-of-year trips promise to be filled with excitement and are a great way to wrap up the school year.

Students will participate in activities throughout the week which will emphasize bullying awareness and prevention, teamwork building skills, and the theme of caring. Bullying Prevention Week will feature a buddy day, a visit from a York Region Police Officer to discuss cyberbullying tips for Grade 6-8 students, and the week will culminate with a special guest speaker at our Friday assembly.
