

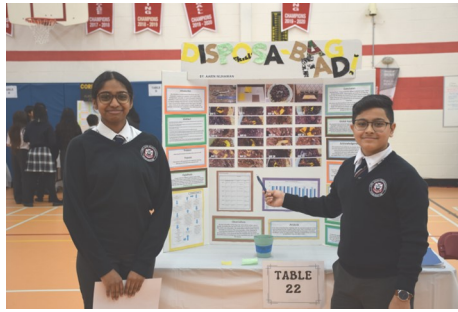
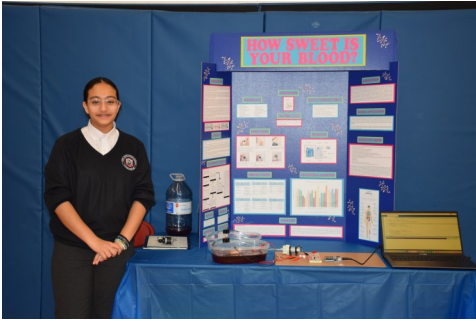

Allergies and Anaphylaxis

Within our school community there are several students who have a potentially severe life threatening allergy (anaphylaxis) to foods, predominantly to peanuts and nuts. Depending on the allergy, students can be at risk through eating, touching or smelling the allergen. The risk to human life presented by anaphylaxis is very severe and we feel the best way to reduce the risk of accidental exposure to these students is to respectfully ask for the cooperation of the parents and guardians to avoid sending known allergens to school, especially peanut butter or products with peanuts or nuts in the ingredients. Common lunch items which should be avoided are Nutella sandwiches and granola bars or other snacks containing nuts.

While the school is not designated as “nut free” or “allergen free”, we do ask for your voluntary support in reducing the serious risk for these students who have anaphylactic allergies. A list of ingredients must be provided for all food brought to the classroom for all special occasions. Classroom teachers will inform you of other known food allergies in class. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated to keep all our students safe!

We would like to wish all our TCPS families, students and staff a well-deserved and safe long weekend. The school will be closed Friday, April 7 and Monday, April 10, and will resume as usual on Tuesday, April 11.
